Senior Pastor Column

- *A. We are too small and we don't have enough money.*
- B. We are exactly the right size and have all the resources we need for what God wants us to do in and through us.

How do these two statements strike you? In every church I have served, no matter the size, location, indebtedness, or numbers, Statement A has often been spoken out loud.

I've almost never heard anyone say Statement B. But isn't this what we want to say about First Lutheran Church of Columbia Heights? To speak with confidence and trust that the Holy Spirit has a mission for us – and will provide what we need to accomplish it?

So much of church history – the history of the Christian Church on earth, from Bible days to now, has included many against-theodds stories. (1) A persecutor of Christians named Saul becomes Paul, the greatest Jesus -witness in history! (2) A group of believers from a back-water, unruly place (Jerusalem) fan out and bring the news of Jesus to the whole world! (3) A monk in Germany calls out the Church on its abuse of power and the whole Christian Church is reformed.

Against the odds, a group of Norwegian-Americans formed a church in this community in 1912. It survived through flu epidemics, world wars, the Great Depression, and more cultural changes than we can count. The work we've done with Kairos and Associates gives our leaders great hope! (See our visioning update on page 6). We possess the optimism, energy, resources and FAITH to accomplish almost anything we can imagine God is calling us to do.

Read that last sentence again: We possess the optimism, energy, resources and FAITH to accomplish almost anything we can imagine God is calling us to do.

Let's imagine, risk and live out the truth of this statement:

We are exactly the right size and have all the resources we need for what God wants us to do in and through us.

Remember, too, these words from the Letter to the Ephesians, Chapter 3: God can do anything; you know—far more than you could ever imagine or guess or request in your wildest dreams! God does it not by pushing us around but by working within us, his Spirit deeply and gently within us.

Glory to God in the church! Glory to God in the Messiah, in Jesus! Glory down all the generations! Glory through all millennia! Oh, yes! Ephesians 3:20-21 (The Message)

Conflict Utilization Training, led by Pastor Steve Goodwin through Kairos and Associates, was held on April 23. Leaders identified the conflict style they've developed, and how to use other styles in different situations. This is a step toward helping us create what Goodwin calls a "culture of psychological safety." It was a great opportunity for personal development that will be of great help to the First Lutheran community.

Community Listening Panels

Two public sessions with Heights community leaders were led by a moderator from our Joshua Team. They shared their perceptions of the community's gifts and needs, as well as how our congregation can partner with other groups. Members of the school board, police department, community organizations, and involved citizens gave their time for these important sessions.

TAKE CARE, DON'T SHARE—How to Protect Your

Personal Data (Clergy Financial Resources & AARP)

It is hard to imagine what an identity thief looks like, but in reality, most private data is remarkably low-tech. Private data theft usual happens because the victim shares valuable information with the thief. Very little "hacking" is actually involved, since the victim is voluntarily posting their private information. Our tendency to "overshare" on social media can make us targets for private data theft.

Examples of theft by oversharing:

- Tom posts online frequently about his coworkers. A thief uses the information to call specific people at his work, pretending to be tech support. At least one employee is fooled, sharing login passwords.
- Richard posts his vacation plans online, bragging about his ocean view. An acquaintance now knows when Richard will be gone. The thief burgles Richard's home, stealing his laptop and tax returns.
- Harold writes a blog about his personal life. An identity thief reads the posts, eventually figuring out Harold's first pet, elementary school, and even his mother's maiden name. The thief uses this info to get through the security questions on Harold's bank account.

How to protect private data and tax information online?

• Use multiple forms of identification. Most web-based accounts require just usernames and passwords for log in. If you have the option, take advantage of multi-factor authentication (MFA), which provides additional layers of security to prove you're who you say you are, including such information as a fingerprint that can be provided on a cellphone.



- Delete!! "Put your hacker hat on," says Robb Reck, chief security officer for the Ping Identity Security firm. "If a hacker were to break into your email what would they find?" What information do you have stored in obvious and not-so-obvious places?" Delete any emails and documents containing sensitive information that would make it easy to access your financial accounts, Reck says.
- Don't use the same password for multiple accounts. Once hackers have your password they're likely to try it everywhere. Instead of passwords, follow this link: http://blog.aarp.org.2017/09/15new -rules-for-password-protection/ to switch to "paraphrases" which are longer and more complex than passwords-to strengthen access to your accounts. Don't post private data like Social Security numbers, addresses, phone numbers, or mother's maiden name that could be used for a log-in.

• File your tax returns as soon as possible. Scammers are using stolen identification to file fraudulent tax returns, according to the IRS. Scammers steal personal information to file a fraudulent tax return and have a tax return deposit sent to the attacker's account.

Filing early helps by not allowing the scammer file because you have already filed, the IRS processes the first return that comes in with your Social Security number.

- Assume everything you put on social media is public information. Basically, if you aren't comfortable having information read aloud on the nightly news, don't post it.
- **Don't post your schedule.** Do not post planned vacation dates or use the "check-in at location" functions on your apps. These can let people know your routines, and when you are away from home, when you are vulnerable to theft.
