Living on a Prayer...

We continue to worship God connected by the Holy Spirit. With only marginal changes in the number of people contracting COVID-19, our online worship format will continue to be our primary focus. We will also continue mailing a Worship at Home devotional for those who do not have internet access.

We aren't taking this pandemic lying down, though! While we have nice weather, we'll continue to offer outdoor-based programming for all ages, along with innovative online worship services. Here is some of what you can look forward to in October and November:

Worship Events:

- **WAITING ON GOD'S PROMISES WORSHIP SERIES CONTINUES** Oct. 4 & 11 in online worship with two stories in the life of God's people through Moses and his siblings, Aaron and Miriam. Our worship will include additional interviews between God and these people entering heaven, "Welcome to the Great Place."
- **BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS:** Oct. 4, 11 AM – 12 PM. Pets provide a lot of comfort in the stay-at-home environment of COVID-19. Honoring the traditional day of St. Francis on Oct. 6, you're invited to bring your furry, feathery, hairy, scaly pet (or a photo of a pet who cannot come to church). You may also enjoy our Community Meal, Holy Communion, Coffee Cart, and Live Music on this day!
- **CELEBRATION OF THE ORDINATION OF WOMEN:** Oct. 18 Online Worship. Bishop Ann Svenungsen, Bishop of the

Minneapolis Area Synod, will preach for our online service at 10 AM. We celebrate 50 years of Lutheran women being ordained in the United States, 40 years of women of color being ordained, and 10 years of LGBTQIA+ individuals being able to serve freely. We also celebrate the gifts and service that women have brought to our church and our world as pastors. As part of this anniversary year, we also lament that service in the Church still carries pain, especially for those barred from serving, and those who have been bullied, dismissed and excluded. Ordaining women goes to the heart of the gospel.

- **RITE OF CONFIRMATION:** Oct. 25, 10 AM Online Worship. As we have done for weddings and memorial services, we will hold an invitation-only worship service in the Sanctuary with families and invited guests the week before. We're recording the service to include in our online worship service on Oct. 25.
- **ALL SAINTS DAY:** Sunday, Nov. 1 (*This is the day our clocks FALL BACK Daylight Savings Time*)
 - 10 AM Online Worship. We will honor members of our community who have died in the last twelve months.
 - 5 PM Online Service of Lament: 200,000 Covid deaths in the U.S.
 - 6 PM Community Candlelight Vigil hosted by First Lutheran in Memory of more than 200,000 US Covid Deaths. The vigil will be held at Huset Park in Columbia Heights.

- **THANKSGIVING 2020**

We will not hold a Thanksgiving Eve service this year, but will use the last Sunday of our "Living on a Prayer" Stewardship Appeal as a day to make our 2021 commitments to support FLC with our gifts and talents, to make a difference in the lives of neighbors who do not have enough to eat, especially with the number of low income families who have lost jobs during the pandemic. Everyone who makes a gift (dollars or groceries) between 11 AM and Noon for SACA will receive a FREE pumpkin pie!

- **LOOKING TO CHRISTMAS EVE 2020**

COVID may keep us from worshipping in the building for Christmas Eve, but stay tuned for some faithful, innovative and fun ideas to celebrate the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ!

COVID Updates:

At the August church council meeting, reviewing information from the CDC and the Minnesota Department of Health, the council decided that there will be no regular Sunday in-building worship services until after the first of the year.

The staff and boards are organizing fall events using outdoor spaces as much as possible. We are allowing small groups to meet inside the building, with guidelines about what spaces are available to use, food service, length of the gathering, and mask wearing, etc., to provide for the safety of all who enter our building.

We continue to host funerals, memorial services, and weddings for 75 people or less in the Sanctuary with physical distancing and the wearing of masks. Singing is limited to soloists. A copy of our policies may be found on our website.

In case of an outbreak of COVID-19 by someone present in our building, the church Council has approved a COVID-19 Policy: Positive Case/Symptom Response (see pg. 7).

Changes in Annual Events to Note:

- ⇒ The annual Holiday Market (bazaar) has been postponed and, if possible, will take place sometime around Easter.
- ⇒ January 2021's Lutefisk & Meatball Dinner has been cancelled due to COVID-19.
- ⇒ Our Annual Meeting in January 2021 will be held as a virtual, online event. *Church Council will announce more details in November.*

\$10,000 Planning Grant Awarded to First Lutheran



Hopeful and exciting news to share: The Mississippi Watershed Management Organization (MWMO) has awarded our church a planning grant of \$10,000 toward our parking lot/rain garden project. What's next? We have a project team to work with our contractor, Earth Wizards, on designing ways we can limit how much water runs into the stormwater system in Columbia Heights and on to the Mississippi River. This will likely include rain gardens and other ways to allow run off from our large buildings and parking lot absorbed in other ways than only into the sewer system. We're also looking at a cistern (large water tank) to gather and filter water from the school roof for use in the Community Garden.

We will submit another grant proposal this fall to request funding from the MWMO to help cover a portion of the cost of the project itself.

We have a great group who have agreed to work on this project: Interim Operations Manager Julie Wilson, Jerry Erickson, Tiffany Lovik, John Miller, and elementary student Lucas dela Cruz, who has a particular interest in this topic!

A grant like this, added to your gifts to the Living Connected Appeal which began one year ago, will make this project possible! Your gifts to the General Fund help take care of day-to-day expenses for FLC, but your additional gifts to the Living Connected Appeal are designated for mortgage payments and to this project, as well as, one day, the resettlement of a refugee family in the Twin Cities. Outdoor After School

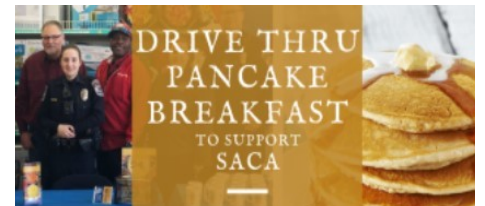
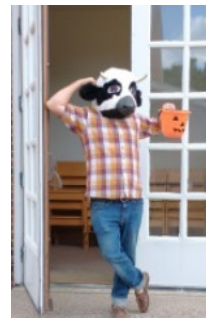

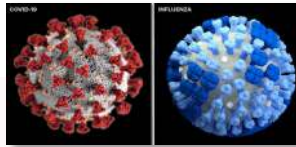

COVID-19 vs. FLU

COVID-19 and the flu have many similarities and differences. Find out what to know and how to protect yourself from these two diseases.

The flu season in North America typically occurs between October and May. It's possible that the viruses that cause COVID-19 and the flu may spread in our community during the same time this fall. If this happens, (scary fact!) people could become ill with one or BOTH at the same time.

COVID-19 and the flu are both contagious respiratory diseases caused by viruses that are spread in similar ways. They both spread between people who are in close contact (within 6 feet). Viruses spread through respiratory droplets released through talking, sneezing, or coughing, along with touching a viral surface and then touching his or her mouth, nose, or eyes.

COVID-19 and the flu have many signs and symptoms in common, making it hard to diagnose, including: Fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, tiredness, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

Both COVID-19 and the flu can lead to serious complications such as pneumonia, organ failure, heart attacks, heart or brain inflammation, stroke and death.

COVID-19 differences: you may experience loss of taste or smell. Symptoms appear 2-14 days after exposure, it can spread virus at least one day before experiencing symptoms. It spreads more quickly than the flu. Lung injury is more frequent, along with blood clots, and the mortality rate appears higher than the flu. No treatment/vaccine is available for COVID-19.

Flu differences: symptoms appear 1-4 days after exposure. Flu can be treated with antiviral drugs, such as Tamiflu or Zofluz. Each year's flu vaccine provides protection from about 3 to 4 influenza viruses, and may be given via injection or nasal spray.

Standard precautions to reduce your risk of COVID-19, the flu and other respiratory infections: Avoid large events or mass gatherings, stay away from someone infected or exhibiting symptoms. Avoid close contact; wash your hands with soap and water or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol; wear a mask; cover your mouth with your elbow or tissue when you cough or sneeze. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Disinfect high touch surfaces such as doorknobs, light switches, electronics (phones) and counters daily.

AND: Get the flu shot NOW in October-it is recommended for everyone over 6 months old. Wear a mask, wash your hands often! If you experience symptoms get tested for COVID-19.

COVID-19 POLICY: POSITIVE CASE / SYMPTOM RESPONSE FLCCH COMMUNITY

For the safety of our FLCCH family and guests, we have created these policies and procedures to manage spread during the COVID-19 pandemic. Note: Failure to follow these policies may lose your event/group the right to use the building for some period of time.

FLCCH has adapted precautionary policies as follows:

Screening / Cleaning / Small Groups / Weddings / Funerals / Phasing Reopening Plan - This is a fluid process.

In the event an individual entering the building does not pass screening the following protocol will be followed:

- The individual will be recommended to obtain COVID testing.
- If the individual refuses testing, they will not be allowed into FLCCH facilities/events for 14 days and/or 7 days from last symptom (whichever is longer).
- Individual will be requested to inform the church office of results for contact tracing to occur.

In the event of a positive COVID test result of a person who attended FLCCH event:

- Report the case to church office ASAP.
- Individual confidentiality will be honored as much as possible.
- Leadership will conduct an initial inquiry of others exposed (in the building at the same time that spent more than 15 minutes, without mask, or within 6 feet of individual).
- Those that were in contact with individual will be asked to quarantine for 14 days.
- The church building (not the school) will be closed for 24 hours to ensure a thorough cleaning of infected areas occurs prior to staff or guest entrance. (School will follow their prodigal)
- If the infected person(s) have been a part of food ministry, and they had direct contact with others, our food distribution would be halted for 2 weeks. *See communication below.*

Status Changes at FLCCH

- If more than one positive case is found – all small group events may temporarily be suspended for 14 days.

Communication

- If more than one positive case is found – the FLCCH community will be alerted regarding the status changes and suspension of events for 14 days via email distribution, website, and phone message.
- The church and school will communicate with each other as these occur.
- If our food distribution programs have been exposed or impacted, our website and phone message will be updated with messaging: *"Due to a positive COVID19 case, our food distribution program will be suspended for 14 days to ensure the safety of all our volunteers & participants. We will resume on [date]."*

Staff have identified Top 5 areas that would require back up and this is compiled for coverage.
