LIVING CONNECTED... LIVING ON A PRAYER

Consider the words of the Lord's Prayer as a wheel -- the wheel does not change, but it never touches the ground in the same place twice.

This simple sentence, written by a beloved professor and poet at Luther Seminary (Gerhard Frost) stays with me.

Where you have offered this prayer taught by Jesus? In worship, at home, at the bedside of a loved one who is seriously ill or dying, at weddings, at camp. Have you prayed it near a lake, or on a mountaintop, or as you gazed on a place in nature that literally took your breath away?

I have been able to visit places where it has been prayed with me in Greek, Malay, Chinese, Swahili and Spanish. Such different kinds of churches, but all worshipping the same God!

During the pandemic, much of our lives have changed. But we continue to offer the Lord's Prayer from wherever we worship, wherever we seek a reminder of God's presence in our daily lives-particularly over the things which we cannot control.

We LIVE on this prayer taught by Jesus to his disciples (Luke 11:1-13) -- and it continues to be a mainstay of our faith practice 2,000 years later. Two thousand years! I can't begin to comprehend all the people, and all the places where this prayer has been offered!

God will bring us through the time of COVID-19. The ministry of our church has had to adapt and innovate, but our call to Live Connected...to God and Each Other continues.

Our theme for our appeal for support this year and into 2021, Living on a Prayer, is a call to remember the constancy of God in an inconstant world. Thank you for your faithfulness in sharing what God has given you to support the ministry of First Lutheran Church!

When life is hard, we are encouraged to seek God in prayer -- maybe on our

knees, maybe in darkness, or in a strange place. But we are also encouraged to pray in the ordinary times and places, reminded of who God is, and what God offers to our lives.

Here is an alternative version of the Lord's Prayer written by a church in England. May this English translation renew the meaning of the prayer in your life in a new way:

Alternative Lord's Prayer

Eternal Spirit, Life-Giver, Pain-bearer, Lovemaker, Source of all that is and that shall be, Father and Mother of us all, Loving God, in whom is heaven: the Hallowing of your Name echoes through the universe. The Way of your Justice be followed by the people of the world. Your Heavenly Will be done by all created beings. Your commonwealth of Peace and Freedom sustain our hope and come on earth. With the bread we need

In the hurts we absorb from one another, forgive us.

In times of temptation and test, strengthen us.

From trials too sharp to endure, spare us.

From the grip of all that is evil, free us.

First Lutheran's Mission Narrative

Living Connected...to God and Each Other

First Lutheran Church, we are called to connection with God, each other, and our neighbors in and beyond Columbia Heights. God connects with us through the reconciling act of Jesus Christ and the daily ministry of God's Spirit.

We connect to God as a spiritual community through worship and prayer, study and the sacraments, and mutual support and service. This sacred connection calls us into relationship with our neighbors with whom God's love has knit us together.

We connect especially to the neighborhood and its youth who have been an essential part of our story from the very beginning when a rural ministry to immigrant children evolved into a long-standing and ever-present calling to love, nurture and mentor young people in our community.

As our neighborhood and world changes we commit to adjust as well, making space for growth, healing, generosity and community-building. We will honor each other's diverse stories and continue living connected to God and to each other. We rely on God's Spirit to guide us.





WE CONTINUE TO ASK YOUR SUPPORT IN AT LEAST THESE TWO WAYS:

- 1. Appeal for the 2021 General Fund to support day-to-day ministry. Our annual need is about \$880,000 (General fund + the Debt Savings fund). With about \$250,000 in rent paid by the Tesfa charter school, we ask your help in the remaining \$630,000. Our goal for 2021 is for member gifts to increase by 5%.
- 2. Continuing multi-year support for the Living Connected Fund -principal and maintenance of the \$1.3 million mortgage and new ministry
 initiatives. Your gift to the Living Connected Fund (whether you
 committed already last year, or are pledging support now) will be split
 80/20 -- 80% used to pay principal and interest on our mortgage, and
 20% as follows:
 - a. Environmental/Safety Initiative: Resurface our parking lot and create rain gardens and other improvements to reduce water runoff to storm sewers and repair broken surfaces on the lot. Estimated expense: \$125,000.
 - b. <u>Mission Initiative</u>: Sponsor a refugee family through Lutheran Social Services. Estimated expense: \$5-7,000. NOTE: this project did not begin as expected as the number of refugees entering the U.S. has greatly decreased because of changes in U.S.policy.

- Three propane patio heaters are extending our ministry outdoors as colder weather appears.
- The After School program has moved indoors, but food service has been re-imagined for more take-home meals. Young people participate now in groups of seven with an adult as they move through programming.
- Our 55+ Singles group went from weekly dinners at restaurants to learning Zoom for Friday night chats, to good-weather local park picnics, and now meeting at church! Talk about adaptation!
- Our Charter School in 2020: Tesfa Academy is using a hybrid model for schooling their 150 students.

DON'T LET YOUR GUARD DOWN —OR YOUR MASK!

Centers for Disease Control (CDC) & World Health Organization (WHO)

I know COVID-19 has gone on long enough, we are sick of masks, we are tired of isolation and the thought of the holidays without families is unbearable. PLEASE! Do not become lax! Keep your **whole face** covered, it doesn't count if your nose is hanging out from your mask. **Warning:** Nurse Jane will call you on this if she sees you!


Please don't let your guard down, keep up the good fight, think of the person next to you at the grocery store that may be autoimmune or going through chemotherapy. Below is a quick refresher on COVID prevention/precautions especially as the holidays approach:

EFFECTIVE COVID-19 PREVENTION TIPS:

Here are steps you can take to reduce your risk of infection. The World Health Organizations (WHO) and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommend following these precautions:

- Avoid large events and mass gatherings.
- Avoid close contact within 6 feet with anyone who is sick or has symptoms.
- Stay home as much as possible and keep distance between yourself and others (6 feet).
- Keep in mind some people may have COVID and spread it to others, even if they don't have symptoms or don't know they have.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Cover your face with a cloth face mask when out in

public spaces, such as grocery stores. Please reserve N-95 and other surgical masks for health-care providers.



- Cover your mouth or nose with your sleeve or tissue when sneezing or coughing. Throw away the tissues and wash/sanitize your hands.
- Clean and disinfect high touch areas daily, this includes your cell phone.
- Stay home from work or school if you are sick.
- Before traveling, check the websites to look for health advisories that may be in place.
- New 10/21/20--Avoid close contact with someone (within six feet) infected for a total of 15 minutes over a 24-hour period

This is a powerful statement from an ICU nurse-" The ills of society, of the world we live in, have exposed us once again. And there's no immunity, no vaccine for that. One day, a vaccine for COVID will be created. But that time is not today. So we must keep fighting. Keep showing up in the ways that we can. And continue to wear our masks and take care of each other. Because, guess what? Whether you wear a mask or not, whether you care about other people and take risks to "live your life," I'll be here, taking care of you (in the hospital)."

FLC Fun Fact: Grant awards help, too!

- We have been awarded \$10,000 for planning our parking lot redesign to improve water quality for our community.
- * Anoka County has granted our church \$10,000 for technology and building upgrades to support The Gathering. This program at First gives caregivers the opportunity to have several hours' respite while offering members of faith communities the opportunity to share in the care of our community's seniors. These improvements will affect what we've traditionally called the "Youth Room," but which is now shared for both ministries.
- * We are applying for a one-year cohort through Luther Seminary to consider alternative ways to fund our ministry.

Administration costs include charter school expenses.

Ways to Give

First Lutheran Church (FLCCH) is funded by the generous, direct donations of its members and friends.

There are several ways you can bless this mission during this time when we are not worshiping together in the Sanctuary:

- 1. Mail or drop off your donation by check.
- 2. Electronic Funds Transfer from our website (flech.org, in the upper right hand corner). You can offer a one-time gift, or recurring donations.
- 3. Bill Pay. Follow your bank's

directions to create First Lutheran as a payee using our mailing address, 1555 40th Ave. NE, Columbia Heights, MN 55421, and create a regular offering that works for your financial needs (weekly, monthly, annually, etc.)

4. Stock Transfer or IRA distribution to the Church. Contact the church office for more information.

Nearly 100 households make regular gifts to the church using electronic giving or bill pay. Giving in this way helps you be consistent in supporting the church, and offers First Lutheran more predictable funding.

WHEN DOES MY GIFT GIVING BEGIN?

Your gifts to both the annual fund and the building fund will begin January, 2021. We are seeking to move closer to being mortgage free while also undertaking some important initiatives to enhance our missional impact. Meeting our goals during this three-year capitol appeal will allow us to reduce our debt and acquire funds for new and renewed ministry.

HOW DO I KNOW HOW MUCH TO GIVE?

Financial Giving is spiritual and personal. There is no minimum (or maximum) that is appropriate for the church. Our church does not place requirements or expectations on any of our members' giving. The model that is taught throughout the Old and New Testament encourages the believer to give a percentage of what they receive. Most frequently, it is taught as a "tithe," which means 10%.

- A. Consider an increased-giving goal of at least 5% over your offering in 2019-2020.
- B. Decide to grow towards a 10% tithe in giving.
- C. Consider committing to a fair share gift. If expenses were divided evenly among all member households, what would be expected?
- D. Pray and ask yourself, "What amount would make me feel generous with the church?" and commit this amount.

MAY GIFTS OTHER THAN CASH BE MADE?

Absolutely! Beyond increasing your "first fruits" giving, which means setting aside a percentage of your annual or monthly income for giving, there are many different ways to give. We encourage you to think of other assets you might give. For many, giving stocks, property, jewelry, cars, or other appreciated assets as a charitable donation can be beneficial to you and to the church. Take a look at the Creative Giving Guide on next page to discover ways of giving you may not have thought about. You may be surprised by how much you can give when you think creatively.

WHAT IS A FAIR SHARE GIFT?

If you do not have a practice of intentional giving to the church, consider a 'fair share.' To meet our goal for the General Fund (\$630,000), we would need 400 households to pledge an average of \$30/week for one year. For the [Church] General Fund, 400 households giving an average of \$30/week would raise our goal of \$630,000. We are not alone in this work!

1. What if I am giving less than a 'fair share'?

Praise God that other people in the church give beyond their means to support the congregation! The church is a community of grace and will continue to offer you all of its ministries even if you give nothing at all. Be glad that God and other members of the church care enough for you and about you to support the church on your behalf.

You may, however, wish to increase your giving - slowly, perhaps, but in ways that will bring you in line with what would be a reasonable expectation for a person of your means. The Bible encourages you to do this.

2. What if I am giving more than a 'fair share'?

Praise God that you are financially able and spiritually willing to do this! God has worked in your life to bring you to this point of faithfulness. Resist any temptation to boost or feel superior to others. Remember that there have no doubt been times when you benefited from the generosity of others. Now you have the privilege of moving beyond duty to delight, of making cheerful sacrifices that exceed minimal responsibilities.

WHAT IF MY FINANCIAL SITUATIONS CHANGE DURING THE GIVING COMMITMENT PERIOD?

At any time during the giving phase, your commitment may be increased, decreased, extended, or cancelled by notifying our church office. No matter your circumstances, we ask you to support First Lutheran's mission in your prayers and generous giving as you are able, and to remember that you are always welcomed and loved.





INCOME-BASED GIVING

PRIORITY BUDGETING | Some people may choose to rearrange their priorities in order to give greater gifts to an appeal. This may lead to postponing a planned expenditure such as a new car, boat, vacation home, etc. One couple delayed the purchase of a new SUV and applied the same monthly payments toward the appeal; enabling them to give an additional \$20,000.

RE-CHANNELING A PRESENT EXPENDITURE

Many families who incur short-term heavy expenditures for special needs, for example while their children attend college, learn to budget their money so they can cover those expenditures. The same philosophy applies when budgeting money to support their church's vision.

UNEXPECTED CASH | A couple who unexpectedly received an inheritance of several thousand dollars decided to give the entire inheritance to their church to expand their gift to the building project. Other people give their income tax refunds.

INCREASES IN INCOME | Many people have incremental salary increases, overtime, or bonuses which they include as part of their gift.

INCOME | Various types of investments distribute interest or dividends. If the donor is not using the distribution for current income, rather than be reinvested, the interest or dividends may be assigned, for a defined period, to the charity. The donor retains ownership of asset.

EXTRA WORK | One man in the process of retiring when the church undertook an appeal secured a new job and gave the first three years of his retirement income to the church. Another woman worked an extra year beyond retirement and gave the full amount to the building project.

Tax advantages should never be assumed. The various gifting strategies have certain tax implications which may or may not affect a specific donor's personal income tax liability. For expert assistance, consult a tax attorney or tax accountant.

ASSET-BASED GIVING

APPRECIATED ASSETS | A gift of investment assets which have appreciated in value is one of the most common gifting strategies.

STOCKS AND BONDS | Funding charitable giving with appreciated stocks or bonds can be very advantageous to both the donor and the church. The donor will avoid paying any capital gains taxes while receiving a full value charitable deduction, and the church will receive a very liquid asset. To claim all these benefits, the stocks/bonds must be transferred to the church rather than selling them and donating the proceeds, which then turns the gift into an ordinary cash gift.

LIFE INSURANCE | Some people have accumulated cash in insurance policies which they give to the church. Others purchase new policies with the church as beneficiary or name the church beneficiary of an existing policy. Donors may also give the entire policy as an outright gift.

IRA ROLLOVER | It is possible to make a gift directly from an IRA. Donors who are 70½ years or older may rollover gifts up to \$100,000/year directly from their IRA to the church. This rollover will count toward their Required Minimum Distribution, will not be taxable income, but will also not be allowed as a charitable deduction for those who itemize their deductions. Donors should contact their IRA administrator to direct their rollover gift to the church.

GIFT ANNUITY | The donor funds a gift annuity with an appreciated asset and gives it to the church; in turn the church distributes a lifetime (or defined period) of income to the donor (and/or spouse). This is an excellent way to convert an appreciated asset into an income source for the donor.

CHARITABLE TRUSTS | Assets are held in a trust.

- The trust distributes income to the donor until death (or defined event) causes the asset to be distributed to the charity.
- 2. In a lead trust, income is distributed to the charity until death (or defined event) causes the asset to be distributed to the donor's estate or family.
