Regulations... and Responsibilities

t last! With vaccination levels climbing, the state of Minnesota -- and First Lutheran Church -- are opening up!

"What shall we do NOW?" our leaders are asking yet again.

Our friends in the United Methodist Church have long used this as a guide principle:

Do all the good you can, for all the people you can, in all the ways you can, as long as ever you can.

While the *regulations* about masking and social distancing, and guidelines for gathering in groups are changing or ending, our *responsibility* to each other continues.

Keep in Mind: Not everyone has been vaccinated, or has access to vaccines (children, in particular), the Covid variants are highly contagious and may be transmitted from a vaccinated person to an unvaccinated person.

I'm grateful for Jane Bugbee's weekly summaries of the changing infection & vaccination environment for us all.

Join us in continuing to do all the good we can by staying away from church when you don't feel well, having a mask with you to wear for indoor events, and investing yourself again in reconnecting with this church community.

We are gaining ground on this virus -- but we are not done yet! Remember, "we don't remove our seat belts five miles from home."

SUMMER WORSHIP SCHEDULE - JUNE & JULY

In light of Governor Walz' orders on May 6, 2021, as well as our experience and knowledge of live streaming worship, I propose:

Worship on Sundays in June and July 2021 will be held at 10 AM only as follows:

- On the 1st & 3rd Sundays, In-Building (on site) with our worship live streamed to the community.
- On the 2nd & 4th Sundays, we'll produce and distribute an Online service only.

In accordance with the State of Minnesota orders, wearing masks will be required inside the building, and optional for outdoor gatherings and events at church. We will follow this beginning May 23.

Here's a handy schedule to put on your calendar for worship at 10 AM on Sundays:

- JUNE 6: In-Building Worship, live streamed to worship from afar
- JUNE 13: On-Line Worship
- JUNE 20: In-Building Worship, *live streamed to worship from afar*
- JUNE 27: On-Line Worship
- JULY 4: In-Building Worship, *live streamed to worship from afar*
- JULY 11: On-Line Worship
- JULY 18: In-Building Worship, *live streamed to worship from afar*
- JULY 25: On-Line Worship

In August, we hope to have the equipment and leadership to worship In-Building each Sunday, with a quality online opportunity available for those who are unable to attend for any reason.

I've Been Meaning to Ask: Curiosity, Courage & Connection *Summer Worship Series in June & July*

...you!?!" (After 14 months, I can list so much I know about you...except your first name!) Has this happened to you as we begin to come together in social groups?

Our 8-week summer series explores questions that help us regain some insights and skills we may have lost during lockdown and quarantine: the ability to have a conversation with someone outside of our bubble! We've been isolated and disconnected, and we searched for hope. Now, we can actually worship together in our Sanctuary (as well as other places) physically!

Here are the questions we will be asking each other this summer: <u>WHERE ARE YOU FROM</u>? God assigns names as the sun, the moon, the plants, animals, and the humans are created in Genesis Chapter 1. In the New Testament, Jesus tells the disciples, "Follow me." <u>WHERE DOES IT HURT</u>? All of us have known pain of some kind, and some much more than others. Before we can help someone in pain, we have to know where it hurts. We need to listen. The woman in the New Testament who was separated from her family for 12 years because of bleeding was so ashamed she didn't even want to speak. She only dared to touch Jesus' robe.

WHAT DO YOU NEED? Job's friends in the Old Testament book with the same name, came and sat with him for five days. Job had lost literally everything -- family and property. They listened to whatever Job needed to say.

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE? After the death of their husbands, Ruth and Naomi, who were not blood relatives, and not even from the same tribal group, formed a new family with just the two of them, committed to love, care and protect one another in a time of grief, and a time of moving forward.

With gentleness and care, we will worship the God of Creating Relationships, who listens and knows our every need, but still asks us these same questions. Remember when Jesus asked, "What do you want me to do for you?"

ELCA Synod Elects First Transgender Bishop

From ELCA.ORG: The Rev. Dr. Megan Rohrer (they/he), San Francisco, Calif., was elected May 8 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Sierra Pacific Synod¹ of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Rohrer is the first transgender² bishop



in the ELCA. The election took place during an online synod assembly.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor of Grace Lutheran Church in San Francisco since 2014 and as community chaplain coordinator for the San Francisco Police Department since 2018. They³ served as executive director of the Welcome Ministry in San Francisco from 2002-2014, assistant night minister for the San Francisco Night Ministry from 2013-2018 and community garden coordinator at Project Homeless Connect, 2010-2012. Rohrer also served as pastor of a multiparish call serving the homeless and hungry at Welcome Ministry, 2006-2014.

Rohrer received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Augustana University in Sioux Fall, S.D., in 2001, a Master of Divinity degree from Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley in 2005, and a Doctor of Ministry degree in 2017. Rohrer is currently a doctoral candidate in transformative studies at the California Institute of Integral Studies in San Francisco. Augustana is one of 26 ELCA colleges and universities.

Rohrer's installation is scheduled for Sept. 11 at St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Walnut Creek, Calif.

¹The Sierra Pacific Synod is one of 65 in the ELCA. Synods unite the work of congregations within their areas, serve as regional support, and guide pastoral and other staff candidates. First Lutheran is part of the Minneapolis Area Synod.

²Transgender: A transgender person is someone who identifies as a gender other than the one they were assigned at birth based on the appearance of their sex organs. Many transgender people experience anxiety and distress that their gender — their personal sense of being male, female, or non-binary — is not reflected by their physical body.

³"They" as a singular pronoun: People have used singular 'they' to describe someone whose gender is unknown for a long time, but the nonbinary use of 'they' is relatively new. If you witness an event from a long distance, and can't identify a person, it is commonly acceptable to say, "They were running quickly across the outfield to help the injured player."

⁴LGBTQIA+: lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex and asexual persons. It is understood as a more acceptable way to describe the individuals that were previously referred to as the "gay community."



Vaccinated Against COVID-19, but I Am Still Anxious? You're Not Alone

re you feeling on edge even after getting your COVID-19 vaccine? Experts say it is natural. Here is why and what to do about it--

Maybe for months you have been imagining the feeling of freedom that would come once you are fully vaccinated. You can get a haircut, hug your friends, eat in a restaurant...the list goes on of what we have been waiting to do when the pandemic restrictions are lifted! feel once again that we have no contro which creates a great deal of stress and anxiety. Coming up with a new routine to replace your pandemic rituals, such as weekly Zoom call with friends, is a wa introduce some level change perhaps to

Yet, you may be surprised to find that when that day comes, the anxiety you've felt during the pandemic year isn't so quick to melt away. Even when we are allowed to gather with a few friends it is stress-inducing, it feels like you are doing something wrong. For other people it can be different combinations of anxiety for your family in terms of our health. It is not just the anxiety about contracting the coronavirus, it's also about what is happening in society, what's happening to our economy, what's happening to our friends and relatives. As of Thursday, May 13, Governor Walz has lifted the mask mandate! Our masks have been our protective armor for over a year!! As our routines change we feel once again that we have no control which creates a great deal of stress and anxiety.

Coming up with a new routine to replace your pandemic rituals, such as weekly Zoom call with friends, is a way to introduce some level change perhaps to a walk with friends instead to adopt new rituals. Plus, scheduling concrete experiences that will ensure that you move forward, even if it feels scary.

I know, I felt scared seeing people without masks at Costco, but I had my mask on, so I did what I needed to do to make myself feel safe.

Gary Roe states, "It's not what happens to you but how you interpret and respond to what happens that makes all the difference to help deal with your stress. Self-care is nutrition, hydration, exercise, rest, and is the best gift to yourself.

Treat yourself with love! Most of all, be kind to yourself as life begins to return to its pre-pandemic rhythms. Because the only sure thing in this uncertain world is that you will feel nervous, tentative hopeful, sorrowful, confused—often all at the same time.

Ultimately, though, connection will prevail, because humans are hardwired to connect. "It felt wonderful to hug again," I hear many saying now that they are vaccinated. We need to trust the vaccines and science to allow us to look forward again.
