Shepherd Me, O God

The Psalms in the Bible were written for many reasons. Here are three categories created by Dr. Walter Brueggemann:

In Times of Orientation – when life makes sense; and we find that creation and God are trustworthy.

In Times of Disorientation - when the bottom drops out of life and doesn't make sense. God and creation may appear untrustworthy, and we lose our direction in life for a time.

In Times of Reorientation - this is when normalcy returns, but our new sense of stability is not quite the same as the old place.

Psalm 23 is a TRUST psalm, and it has one foot in disorientation (though I walk through the valley of darkness) and one foot in reorientation (you prepare a table for me in the presence of my enemies).

To me, this is exactly where we are in the midst of the Covid-19 Pandemic, straddling confusion and stress, as well as seeing God's hand at work to bring us through!

You can understand why this Psalm is so often read at a funeral – it names what has been lost and the journey that led to death – but it also speaks to God's promises to give us life beyond this life.

I hope you will join us for this 40-day journey of discovery focused on this one bit of the Bible that has shaped so much of our life as Christians.

Shepherd Me, O God: Psalm 23

The 23rd Psalm is one of the best known pieces of scripture by Christians all over the world. It is a text that is quick to the lips in hospital rooms, at funerals, and in daily moments of need. The ancient words of this song have a way of sticking with us, nestling into our bones, and singing us home. During the season of Lent, we will return



to this text day in and day out. We will pray it regularly, allowing it to enter our daily vocabulary at home, work, school, or community. And by reciting these words together, we will encounter a God who shepherds all of us, and discover in ourselves a need for the love of a shepherd to tend our needs. ~ From Church Anew

Beginning on Ash Wednesday (March 2), we will speak and listen to this psalm of trust, spoken from the voice of those who long for rescue, for basic needs, and assurance of God's love and grace.

Our worship and home practice will include:

- Weekly worship on both Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings
- Learning this psalm thoroughly for our own wellbeing
- Trying out faith practices each week to help our own growth
- A devotional book at home
- A new podcast from our church using daily readings from the Gospel of Luke through the season of Lent
- Our annual Last Supper Drama to remind us of Jesus' last days and hours
- Holden Evening Prayer for our Wednesday midweek worship, along with messages from church leaders around the world about what Psalm 23 means in different places and contexts.
- Weekly devotional books for home reading, or at circle and board meetings
- First communion instruction for families

A Policy to Allow Service of Alcohol on Site

The Council has spent a good amount of time considering whether or not to allow alcohol to be served on our premises. This review was prompted when the Synod asked to hold an outdoor reception on our grounds to include nonalcoholic and alcohol beverages. The policy approved by the Council may be read here: <u>Alcohol Policy: Jan. 2022</u> Please note that our policy takes into consideration the requirements of the City of Columbia Heights, as well as responsible and hospitable service of drinks with food.

A ceremonial toast by members of the church at a meeting or other gathering does not require a license if everyone in attendance is a member of our congregation.

Council Updates: Finding a New Tenant

Staff members Julie Wilson and Nathan Roberts have a task group looking to find a new charter school or other education tenant for the 2022-2023 school year. Warren Watson, Randy Bergman, John Miller, David Hagen, Chris Larson are also members of this group.

We are in the process of signing a realtor listing with Christianson and Co. to expand the search for a new education tenant. If we do not have a new school identified by March 1, the Council will form a second working group to look at other revenue-raising opportunities for our extra space.

Rental income in the neighborhood of \$200,000 or more is needed to support our ongoing day-to-day operations.
