We created this mission narrative in 2019 to guide our work:

First Lutheran Mission Narrative: Living Connected...to God and each other!

At First Lutheran Church, we are called to connection with God, each other, and our neighbors in and beyond Columbia Heights.

God connects with us through the reconciling act of Jesus Christ and the daily ministry of God's Spirit.

We connect to God as a spiritual community through worship and prayer, study and the sacraments, and mutual support and service. This sacred connection calls us into a relationship with our neighbors with whom God's love has knit us together.

We connect especially to the neighborhood and its youth who have been an essential part of our story from the very beginning when a rural ministry to immigrant children evolved into a long-standing and ever-present calling to love, nurture and mentor young people in our community.

As our neighborhood and world changes we commit to adjust as well, making space for growth, healing, generosity and community-building. We will honor each other's diverse stories and continue living connected to God and to each other. We rely on God's Spirit to guide us.

Everything we do can be lifted up to this statement to verify that what we are doing helps us to live connected to God and each other.

Every dollar you give to First Lutheran Church contributes to the continued story of God's

work in us through Jesus Christ for the sake of our neighbors! That is exciting to consider – through the donations you make, along with the donations of people sitting across from you at church, or who attend the other service, or who join us for worship online – all of YOUR GIFTS make a difference in whether the grace and mercy of Jesus Christ are shared with others.

Commitment Sunday for the 2023 General Fund support will be on November 20. I ask you to prayerfully consider what your household is able to contribute to the work we do in Jesus' name through First Lutheran Church.

- 1. A Pledge form for 2023 is included in this Caller and will available in our bulletins in November. It was also mailed to homes with your giving statement through September 30.
- 2. Your commitment before Nov. 20 helps us to plan our budget (our missions) for 2023.

It is true that salaries and benefits for staff represent a sizable number in our budget. Consider our pastors and program staff as conductors of an orchestra, or of several musical ensembles. We invite people to share their unique gifts and talents. And together, we create something bigger and more beautiful than anything we can do on our own. I'm grateful for the support this congregation showed to our staff when we were separated by the pandemic. We adapted and learned and continued to center ourselves in Christ.

Thank you for the gifts you and your household offer out of the generosity God has provided to you. Remember, we are not all asked to give the same amount, but in proportion to what God has given us.

- A. Updating the Constitution: Our congregational president, Warren Watson, has been reviewing the ELCA Model Constitution in order to update our Constitution, which has not been updated since 2010! Attend one of the two Town Halls on Nov. 13, 27.
- B. A First Lutheran Welcome & Inclusion Statement: Over the last few years we have had several requests to clarify our stance as to whether our church supports the LGBTQ+ community. We have had specific requests from gay and transgender parents of our After School program, several LGBTQ+ youth and parents in our church, gay and transgender parents from our tenant, Marigold Preschool. We also regularly are in conversation with LGBTQ+ community members looking for a local church.

Our staff tells people that we support LGBTQ+ families and couples in our church. But we would like this stance to also come from the church council and congregation.

The Church Council approved the Welcome & Inclusive Statement below in September, and will ask the congregation to formally adopt it at the Annual Meeting.

WELCOME & INCLUSION STATEMENT: First Lutheran Church strives to be inclusive and welcoming to everyone in our church, our community, and our partner organizations. We seek to connect and serve our neighbors wherever they are on their faith and life journey. We aim to support people of every race & culture, age & ability, family structure & economic status, and every sexual orientation & gender.

The statement will be reviewed at the Town Hall Meetings in November.

REMEMBER, the Nov. 13 Town Hall will be at 11:15 in person at church. The second Town Hall on Nov. 27 will be held by Zoom, with the link published at least one week prior.

- C. Facility Projects:
 - a. The Parking Lot has been repaved, more handicap parking places added, new raised gardens constructed and partially planted (some plants were not available this fall), and added sidewalks to improve pedestrian access. Now we will be working on signs to educate the community about our project and how they can better manage water use where they live.
 - b. Lighting: Thanks to an anonymous donation and a grant from the MNCEE (Minnesota Center for Energy and Environment), we will replace all of the 1,000 indoor florescent light fixtures in our building by Nov. 15.
 - c. Replacing the Sanctuary Roof. Again, thanks to an anonymous donation, we have the funding to (1) replace the shingles on the Sanctuary roof; and (2) repair/modify the cupola atop the Sanctuary.


Christmas at First on Sunday, Dec. 11. Included in this concert will be sacred as well secular holiday favorites to get you in the Christmas spirit! All are welcome!

Invitation & Information about FLCCH's Immigration & Refugee Ministry Team

First Lutheran Church's Spiritual Growth Board with eleven other members of our congregation has taken its first steps in helping immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers. We are officially members of the EMMAUS Network with Lutheran Immigration & Refugee Services (LIRS) after completing a three-week discernment process together in August and September. A certificate is expected to be presented to Council at our annual board meeting in January.

Now that we are members of EMMAUS the next step is to form a ministry team to meet quarterly to learn, pray, and communicate recommendations for action to council on immigration issues as they impact



our community, neighbors, and members of our congregation.


