MAPPING OUR FAITH



hope you have taken the MAP (Mission Assessment Profile) already! <u>This is one</u> of the most important ways you can share with our leaders your thoughts about the current ministry of First Lutheran Church, Columbia Heights.

With the input of 150 or more of our community members, you will help to influence the shape and future of our congregation!

Surveys didn't exist in the Bible, but there were times when people used stones to make a vote, or to cast lots to win a prize.

Other than the grand Judean temple in Jerusalem, there were no community groups who shared property in common for worship and fellowship and service. In the early church, homeowners offered their residence for "house churches."

This effort is part of the work of the F.A.M.I.L.Y. group (Warren Watson, Ruth Dodson, Grace Fishbeck, Becca Stolba, Jeff Beck and me, as well as our consultant Jeff Kjellberg). Pray for them and the work they do to receive input from the congregation, consult with trusted resources about options before us, and work toward a recommendation to our congregation about our long term future.

A COMMITMENT TO GENEROSITY - November 2023

My nearly 3-year-old grandson touches my heart each time he says to me, "I love you so very much." This is usually accompanied by a tight hug. He's showing a generous spirit to me, unconditional love and commitment to our relationship.

We mark relationships with other human beings in many ways: Rings exchanged on a wedding day. Cards and personal notes exchanged. Commitment to a mortgage! A deck built. Handmade gifts created from new or repurposed materials. Acts of devotion and love.

How do we show our commitment to God? We mark this relationship as well – through our worship, our prayers, our acts of service and justice, as well as our generosity with Christ's Church. In this case, with First Lutheran Church.

What we give matters. It is a gift given freely, without guilt or shame, without a bill invoiced to us, without coercion.

Our building is bursting with energy and activity! All three of our schools had a great start to the 2023/24 school year and our get together with the school's educators was informative and well received. Bultum Academy has added two extra classrooms to their lease that they will use for ESL and special ed classes. Therefore, SIXTEEN classrooms were readied – super cleaning, including hardwood floors, carpets and walls; painting; repairs; electrical upgrades for modern teaching. The things you can't plan for – wasp nests, mice, etc. And every fall, lots of cardboard to recycle as new books and equipment are received. There are about 270 school children in our facility every school day!

The Property Committee continues to address building repair needs. Katie Luther Room has been renovated and groups have been meeting there regularly. Our parking lot light poles have been refitted with LED fixtures to reduce energy costs and light pollution, and improved visibility at night. Soon the lights in the Sanctuary will be replaced. The Finance Team has decided to also invest \$250,000 of those funds to receive a high interest return.
