Dear Friends in Christ,

It is with deep gratitude that I write to you in this position as interim senior pastor of FLC. I had intended to turn things back over to Pastor Bonnie by now for this newsletter responsibility. However, as you've no doubt read, she is not following the schedule/timing following surgery that she thought she would be on.

That brings up the questions: Are we ever going to be on our preferred schedule? How does timing work for us as a child of God? What's the best attitude to have when change is afoot?

When Jesus was asked about timing matters - re: the specific schedule of God's work in God's world - he responded as recorded in Acts 1:7 "It is not for you to know the times or the seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority." Message received!

aftermath of a disaster or emergency. Honeybees cost \$20 and provide honey to eat and beeswax plus the bees help pollinate plants.

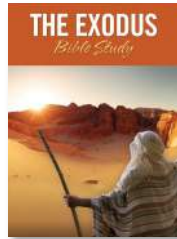

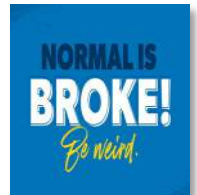

Hello from the desk of the Finance & Operations Manager.

The College Choir sang a choral piece by Josef Anton Bruckner and was accompanied on the organ by our very own Jeffrey Patry. Still mourning the loss of my mom I was struck by the beauty of the Sanctuary and the wonderful sounds of the organ as well as the talent of the Choir. It made me feel at peace and appreciative of the experience I was given as part of my work environment.

This collaboration with another nonprofit organization is only one example of the many activities happening at FLCCH to engage in outreach, carry out the church's mission and to welcome the cooperation with other nonprofit partners. But inviting other communities to our campus also means the need for scheduling and maintaining it. Joyce continues to oversee our facility usage, invoicing, safety precautions and maintain various building calendars.

During this quarter alone, Jody and his team repaired bathroom sinks, rearranged the Commons Area, painted walls, made sidewalks safer by spreading woodchips and completed replacing of lights and repairing the window in the Sanctuary. The maintenance team has also worked hard to create a list of long term project goals in order to be a responsible landlord to our tenants.



Nathan has started to form a task force joined by congregation members and staff to help and complete new lease negotiations with our current schools. In this issue I also want to address a couple of tax questions regarding the tax exempt status of DAF and IRA made charitable donations which have come up recently.

If a donor contributes to FLCCH through a donor-advised fund (DAF) or through an IRA fund those donations are considered tax deductible. Donors who contribute to the DAF or an IRA receive an immediate tax deduction When the donor recommends these grants to go to the church, FLCCH receives these funds and they will be recorded in our donation software as charitable donations. However, on the tax giving statement those donations will not be marked as tax exempt as they have already received a tax deduction. Instead, each donor receives an individual donation receipt letter at the end of the tax year as their tax receipt clearly stating that these donations have been distributed by a DAF or an IRA account. These letters can be forwarded to the donor's tax accountants or kept as individual records as official tax receipt documentation.
