Blessings—Dear Friends in Christ,

I've had the privilege of serving here at First Lutheran Church for far longer than anyone expected me to be here. Initially, I was going to be here for 1 ½ months in the winter beginning Jan. 7 and then (possibly) return for 12 more weeks this spring/summer (for Pastor Bonnie's scheduled sabbatical ending July 8).

Now (as of the writing of this piece) we've just received an update from Pastor Bonnie which indicates that she's not going to be returning at the end of the summer, as she had more recently planned to do. Based on her slowed recovery process we're seeing a further delay in her hoped-for trajectory to return to work. As information becomes available, we'll continue to update you as to her status and a tentative plan for her next steps.

Here's another update. We're going to be working with our partners in the Minneapolis Area Synod office to navigate the decisions that need to be made for the sake of the mission of our congregation and for Pastor Bonnie's well-being - and to make sure we follow "good process" along the way. Rev. John Hulden will be our point person. In the end, we don't know for sure what the timetable will be and where this transition journey is taking us regarding Pastor Bonnie and our future. But we do know the following things...

We know that we love Pastor Bonnie and want only the best for her. In her absence, we know that the current staff and pastors have continued to do their best to support the leadership and ministry of this church in the midst of this vibrant transition time. As interim pastor, I'm grateful for their partnership with me in the Gospel! It's a joy and a privilege to work with all of them.

Together with volunteers and church leaders, we know that we've been working very hard at managing the many changes going on. These include transitions with our ministry partners and with the building that have occurred. We know that it's been both rewarding and challenging to undergo this time of uncertainty.

We also know that God's been generous in providing us with an opportunity to "keep our heads down" in terms of just continuing to do God's work - without losing focus or getting disheartened or discouraged. We've continued to trust in God's leadership and - we've received wonderful blessings along the way. God is so gracious to sustain us these days!!

Our on-going requests from you, the members and friends of this congregation, are these: Please keep on praying for God's blessings to come upon us and upon all of God's creation in abundance. Ask for God's wisdom to be with all those making crucial decisions that affect the future of this Spirit-led ministry that we are stewarding. And please offer, alongside our parallel prayers - petitions of gratitude and thanksgiving!!

Please also join us in making the contributions you feel called to make (in all the ways you give - including financial) and continue deepening your involvement in the life of this church in spirit-led ways. We need your best efforts now, as we begin our work this Autumn. It's crucial that we work together in times when life can pull us apart. God's ministry through us truly matters!

In the end, we'll be partners in this ministry at our congregation - you and I - until we're not. I'm here as an interim and I intend to continue solely in that role until this interim "season" is concluded. It's been a joy and I'm grateful for this chance to serve.

End of Summer Sermon Series in Process

On July 14 we began a sermon series on the Beatitudes. It's called "Blessed to Bee a Blessing." By the time we will finish with this on Sept. 1 we'll have covered being poor in spirit, mourning, being meek, hungering and thirsting for righteousness' sake, being merciful, being pure in heart, peacemaking, and being willing to suffer for Christ.

We're even having some fun as we reference our theme around bees, hoping that our conversations about what it means to be blessed will be "buzzing" with good things. It's been so great to have new understandings of the meaning behind a blessing from God!

Continuing with this playfulness, we hope to "pollinate" this faith community through the Spirit's work so that the kinds of words and deeds on our part that will result in the sweetest of all blessings - will lead to all the things that Jesus promises to the blessed in Matthew 5. They are: experiencing the kingdom of heaven, being comforted, inheriting the earth, being filled, receiving mercy, seeing God, and being called children of God.

Please join us in worship as we are blessed and as we seek to be a blessing to all of creation!

Fall Sermon Series "Dreams" based on poem by Langston Hughes



Starting Sept. 8 we'll dive into some stories and wisdom of scripture that will encourage and inspire us to persevere through hard times. As we hold fast to the dreams and visions that God implants in our hearts and minds, we are able to be steadfast in our faith and our work on behalf of Christ Jesus.

Hello from the desk of the Finance & Operations Manager

I was recently handed an original of the April 1973 First Lutheran Church Caller and couldn't help reading through the "A look at our Stewardship" section. Back in 1973 for the month of April a total of \$12K was donated by worshippers. In today's times that translates to a total of \$85K. The average attendance per service was 1000. That is \$19 per donor. Forward to today: In comparison, in April of 2024, a total of \$32K was donated by circa 290 donors. That translates to an average of \$110 per worshipper. So while the medium giving total has increased considerably nowadays it only covers roughly 1/3 of April's total expenses of 98K. This is a pretty powerful analysis. Luckily FLCCH is in the fortunate position to be able to cover the remainder of monthly expenditure with the lease income from Bultum Academy.

While the congregation and staff work hand in hand with Bultum's leadership and staff to further their tenant relationship, the following months will be very busy with projects negotiated under the new lease agreement. Until students return back to school the building is bustling with noise and a lot of energy to get everything done in time for the new school year.

On another note, after giving our previous janitor Derek Borgen Sabot a big farewell we are also in the process of hiring a new janitor. Details are in the Sunday bulletin if anyone you know is interested in this position. Future projects in the pipeline are repairs to our HVAC system, updating electrical and plumbing work, the replacement of the AC in the Sanctuary and building a fence around the schoolyard.
