SIX FAITH-FORMING FALL SERMONS

We give thanks for this Autumn season in terms of our return to the programming year of the Church. For our Sunday sermons, we'll spend our time in the New Testament: in Luke & 1st Timothy.

On Sunday, Sept. 7 we'll emphasize "Moving Forward" with Jesus. He asks us to count the cost of discipleship and plan for the future.

On the 14th we'll hear from the writer of 1st Timothy about "Mercy Forever." We delight in God's plan to show us grace eternally.

On the 21st of September we learn about the importance of "Managing Faithfully." The parable from Luke focuses on the value of relationships with God and with each other that center on love.

Sept. 28, we return to 1st Timothy to learn about "Firm Footing" When it comes to running the race before us, we need to be grounded in grace not mixed up by money.

Oct. 5 brings us to "Mustardseed Faith." We get a chance to see how mighty God's power is in the world if we will use even the tiniest bit of faith that God gives us to trust in God's guidance.

Finally, on Oct. 12, we finish up our first series of sermons with the story of the 10 Lepers "Meeting Faithfulness" in the healing of Jesus. Our savior comes to make us whole and is so very eager to welcome our gratitude for God's grace.

FALL STEWARDSHIP FOCUS

Starting Oct. 19 this Autumn, we're kicking off a 4-week sermon series that centers on God's generosity. We'll emphasize "Giving Connected" as we give members and friends of our congregation the opportunity to make faith promises in reference to how they'll be supporting the work of this church in 2026.

The two word "mission tagline" of this church is Living Connected. The point of choosing Giving Connected as our stewardship emphasis Fall focus is to link our living with our giving. It's all about responding to God's generosity in giving us all that we have and then.... Giving back a portion.

We'll focus on the giving of time - volunteering and sharing talents. Giving of spiritual support - through prayers and sharing stories of how this church is making a difference in the lives of God's people. And last, but not least - giving of financial resources that belong to God and are given to us "in trust." We get to show how much we trust God in the making of our promises and prayerful intentions we make - indicating how much money we'll pledge to give in 2026 to support this life-changing ministry that the Spirit is empowering us to carry out in Jesus' name.

Oct. 19, we'll check out how Jacob, a key figure in the Bible, leaves an encounter with "the holy" with a limp. His wrestling

with God shows us that God wants us to walk with a gimp in our giving. You are invited to get close enough to God, as you wrestle with matters of faith - and finances - so that all people will know you've struggled with God in this holy matter.

Oct. 26 we'll revisit a familiar lesson - the story of the self-righteous supposed holy man, who brags about his worth to God and his chintzy giving to God as this man stands in contrast to the person who gives a small monetary amount but shows faithful trust in God in humility.

Nov. 2 we'll check out what it looks like to do some giving involving forGIVEness, as we emphasize a ministry of hospitality and love. This will be a special heart-centered Sunday as we marvel in God's mercy!

Finally, we'll wrap up the Fall Stewardship Focus time on Nov. 9 in joy and gratitude. In looking to an Old Testament lesson, we'll visualize ourselves on a journey of thankfulness as we highlight thanksGIVING in our daily lives.

We look forward to your prayerful involvement in this Stewardship campaign. This is all about God's love and the joy we get to share as we trust in God's work in our lives and gratefully give of ourselves with freedom and peace.




Young at Heart Christmas Dinner Tuesday, Dec. 16 at 12 PM

Hello from the desk of the Finance & Operations Manager

Even though the summer months are usually less busy at FLCCH giving staff members and volunteers the opportunity to take vacation days to spend valuable time with their friends and family, the list of tasks to accomplish and meeting deadlines hasn't slowed down. Taxes for 2024 are done and our liability has been paid, we have contracted with an auditor for a compilation audit (I am in the midst of pulling reports and documents for our auditor), leaders are already preparing for this year's stewardship campaign, funds have been secured for upcoming maintenance projects and the list goes on.

One of the big decisions the M&E committee, the Board of Finance and the Church Council had to tackle was to decide to either pay off the mortgage or refinance the mortgage facing a higher interest rate. The decision was made to be financially conservative and only pay down \$110,000 and to refinance the remainder of the loan with the focus to reevaluate another mortgage pay down in the future once a new Senior Pastor will be on board. This amount will be paid from a General Fund CD that was invested wisely in the past with the Mission Investment Fund.

The tenant task force has successfully renewed a new one year lease with Bultum Academy for the school year of 2025/26. They are also working diligently to secure another one year lease for the 2026/27 school year with the goal to have the lease signed by Bultum management by August 15.

This guarantees that the budget for Fiscal Year 2026 can rely on a steady lease income.

Jody has secured a bid for a new sanctuary AC unit with Gilbert Mechanical which the Church Council has blessed. The cost will be around \$150,000 which will be paid from the same above mentioned General Fund CD. His team including himself, Roger and volunteers are working hard on getting the class rooms upstairs ready for the new school year, doing minor repairs and tackling the weeds in the garden beds around the campus. Even though it starts to look much nicer there is still a lot of additional work to be done including adding blooming perennials in some of the garden beds.

The 2nd qtr. of 2025 has been financially sound due to generous incoming donations even through the traditionally slower summer months. We closed with a net revenue as of June despite increased expenses due to the inflation rate. Your generosity enables FLCCH to not just run the operations successfully but to also give back to the community. These include quarterly benevolence payments, being able to run the after-school program during the summer months, sending the FLCCH youth to Lake WAPO camp and on their youth trip to Chicago and translating signs and bulletins for our Spanish speaking community members.

Thanks to all of you FLCCH keeps being a financially healthy and viable community.
